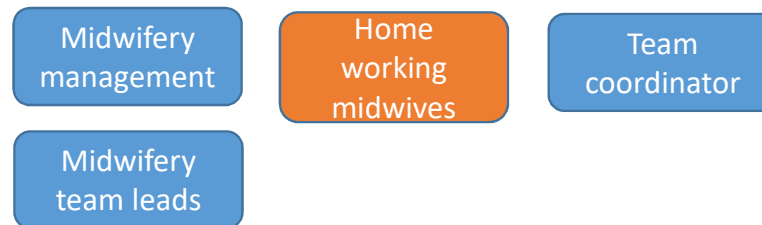
Potential Outputs

- Continue staff training, updates and enhance communication

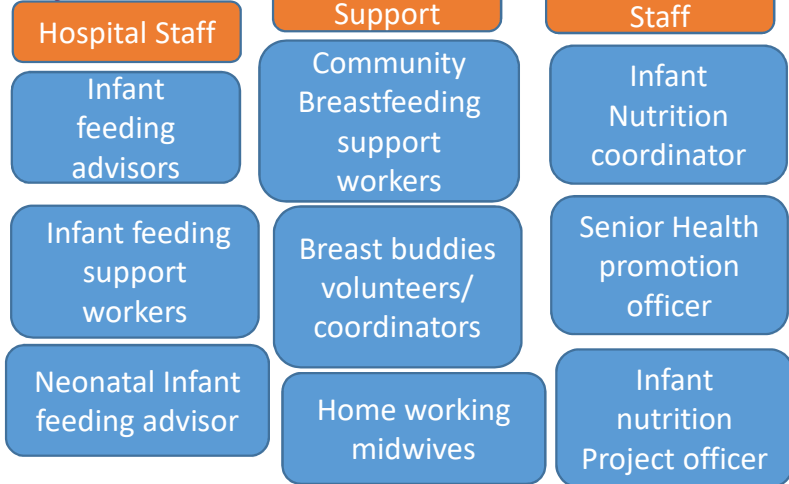
Interdependencies
